AAI to equip Bengal's first Greenfield airport

KOLKATA: The Airports Authority of India (AAD has volunteered to equip Bengal's first Greenfield airport (an airport that is built from scratch in a new location) in Durgapur and help it launch

operations at the earliest.

According to senior AAI officials and those at Bengal Aerotropolis Projects Limited (BAPL), some critical equipment to facilitate launch of operations has already reached Kazi Nurrul Islam Airport.

"The MET (Meet Evolving

Threats) equipment have arrived in Kolkata and will be moved to the Durgapur airport soon," Partha Ghosh, managing direc-

tor, BAPL, said.
DVOR, a critical navigational
equipment, and VHF, a communication aid, have already
reached the Durgapur airport,

sources said.
"Installation work will begin
soon. Experts from the AAI
headquarters in Delhi will be
here (in Durgapur) to oversee
the installation process." S
Bhaduri, regional executive
director (RED), eastern region,
AAI said.

"We were waiting for power supply at the airport and are now ready to begin the installation process," Bhaduri said, adding that the MET equipment would also be up and running soon.

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Once done with the installation process, the AAI would shift focus to the calibration process.
The agency would fly in a special aircraft from its Delhi headquarters to begin the calibration

process.

The installation, once complete, would enable the airport authorities to apply for licence at DGCA (Directorate General of Civil Aviation, The DGCA would then send a team for inspection, following which the airport would get the green light to begin operations.

sources said.

Ghosh said the installation of precision approach path indicator (PAPD) is already on and would be done soon. However, he said that there was still some work to be done to facilitate better road connectivity between the airport and National

Highway 2.

A meeting to review and assess the preparedness of the Durgapur airport was held at HIDCO Bhawan in New Town.

The meeting featured top AAI officials and DGCA, in addition to representatives from such airlines as Air India, Jet Airways, IndiGo, Go Air, Spice-Jet, Air Costa and such non-scheduled carriers as Sprit Air, Par Air, Bafna Aviation, Airbus (eurocopter) and Pinnacle Air.

Top officials of the police administration and fire services department were also present at

the meeting.

Some non-scheduled airlines are reportedly keen to operate flights to and from the state's first Greenfield airport.
